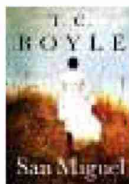

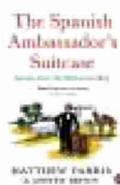

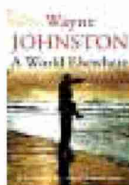

Landish Druken,

son of a Newfoundland sealing captain, is expelled from Princeton in the 1890s for plagiarism. Wishing to be a writer, he lives in drunken poverty and, in desperation, turns to his fabulously wealthy and eccentric friend, Van Vanderluyden. Drawing on the real-life Vanderbilt legend, this is a strange, utterly original novel, essentially about fathers and sons.
